The Workshop builds on the successful public event 'The Care of Older People in Norfolk' at the Assembly House, Norwich on 16 September 2011. It is hoped that by pooling their knowledge, our speakers from Britain and Japan can help to transcend national boundaries, highlight important common themes, and suggest possible ways forward, learning from each other.
